



## Cheryl A. Hickmon Scholarship Award



#### **Eligibility criteria:**

- African American female graduating senior with a minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.00 scale.
- Applicants must reside and attend high school in Hartford County (excluding Bristol and Southington), Windham or Tolland Counties, or within the cities of Cromwell, East Hampton, Colchester or Lebanon, CT.
- The application must include all required documents submitted along with the application. To be eligible, the completed application must be received by *March 1, 2023*.





## Result 1. Children Enter Kindergarten Ready to Learn

Percent of children entering kindergarten who demonstrate age-appropriate functioning across multiple domains of early learning using the school readiness assessment required by the state and collected by local school district = Kindergarten Entrance Inventory (KEI)

## Kindergarten Entrance Inventory



#### **Three Performance Levels**

- Performance Level 1: demonstrate <u>emerging</u> skills and require a <u>large</u> degree of instructional support.
- Performance Level 2: <u>inconsistently</u> demonstrate the skills and require <u>some</u> instructional support.
- Performance Level 3: <u>consistently</u> demonstrate the skills and require <u>minimal</u> instructional support





## **School Readiness**



- Starts at birth
- Impacted by support from families and communities in learning
- Impacted by exposure to learning activities including speaking with and reading with children

## School Readiness Strategies



- •Increasing access to books and frequency of reading with children through a monthly book subscription program (Dolly Parton's Imagination Library)
- Increasing children's vocabulary and enhancing their conversational abilities through a parent-directed, play-based program (Words Count)
- •Increasing child's development and how to build their child's brains through daily talk and interaction (Hartford Talks)

# Dolly Parton's Imagination Library







- Children 0-5 may be enrolled online
- Books delivered monthly
- Enrollment tactics
  - Working with Community Health Center to enroll families
  - Partner with childcare centers
  - Community events
  - Share information with other organizations through City of Hartford DFCYR Workgroups

# Dolly Parton's Imagination Library







#### National results:

- DPIL participants experience increased frequency of reading at home, greater family engagement and interest around books, and a home literacy environment enhanced by the significant number of books delivered.
- DPIL participants also show evidence of improved skills directly related to kindergarten readiness, namely letter identification, phonologic awareness, and letter naming fluency.
- An urban school district found that DPIL participants scored better on the language and math sections of its validated kindergarten readiness indicator than nonparticipants.

#### Local results:

- There are currently 4,939 Hartford children aged birth-five enrolled in our free book-subscription program; that is just under 70% of all eligible children.
- Additional data to be compiled this year

- Suggest ideas about how we should adjust our approach to enrollment etc.

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


#### **Who We Are:**

The goal of the ECCP is to support the healthy social and emotional development of young (birth to age five) children by offering support and consultation to those who care for these children.

Funded and supported by Connecticut's Department of Children and Families and the Office of Early Childhood.



# Children who are socially and emotionally healthy...

- Are usually in a positive mood
- Listen and follow directions
- Have close relationships with caregivers and peers
- Care about friends and show interest in others
- Recognize, label, and manage their own emotions
- Understand others' emotions and show empathy
- Express wishes and preferences clearly
- Gain access to ongoing play and group activities
- Are able to play, negotiate, and compromise with others
- Have a generally positive self-image

(adapted from McClellan & Katz 2001 and Bilmes 2012).

- Key programs: Early Learning Centers, School Readiness, Family Child Care Network, Hartford Talks, and more


