





# HPS Culture, Climate and Equity Survey




- Administered to students (in 3<sup>rd</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grades), parents/caregivers, and staff in October and June each year


# Healthy Homes/N.E.A.R.



## What do we do?

Improve the living conditions for families by conducting inspections and addressing hazards in homes. During the inspection, we look for:

- Mold Growth
- Asbestos & Radon
- Carbon Monoxide
- Unsafe stairs/ Broken hand rails
- Pests
- Electrical Hazards
- Tripping Hazards
- Lead (Healthy Homes Only)
- Lead windows/doors





# Healthy Homes/N.E.A.R.



## Who do we serve?

Healthy Homes serves all of CT, including Hartford.

N.E.A.R. serves Hartford with a focus on the North Hartford Promise Zone.

## To qualify:

- Home must be built before 1978 for lead treatment. (Healthy Homes only)
- Commit to owning the property for at least three years after the project is finished.
- Owner must follow federal fair market rent guidelines.
- Owner/ Residents must follow residential income limits.
- Owner must give priority to families with children under the age of 6. (Healthy Homes only)



# Healthy Homes/N.E.A.R.



## What to expect


- Learn what it means to maintain a healthy home and how lead can impact health.
- Connections families to community resources, when need it.
- Develop a scope of work and coordinate bids.
- Work with licensed contractors.
- A grant to fund projects; forgiven after 3 years.
- Relocation education.
- Bilingual services available.
