





Ideal State-Ascend Pipeline






Ideal State-Ascend System Building Connecticut







San Juan Center

Employment Program



What do we do?

San Juan Center serves the Latino population in Greater Hartford, including providing youth career navigation services. While we served predominantly the Latino population, we also serve 39% of African American and 3% Asian clients.

Who do we serve?

Their efforts align with Promise Neighborhood Program Results and Indicators.

- Brief justification for the use of contractors selected: Many residents living within the North Hartford Promise Zone identify as Hispanic or Latino. San Juan Center offers culturally appropriate services to youth and families that align with Promise Neighborhood Program Results and Indicators.
- Amount of time the project will be working with the contractors: Connecticut Children's will work with the San Juan Center over the entire project period (5 years).

Employment Program



How to get connected

Clients will complete an initial written assessment and will be interviewed by the Career Navigator. The clients will be offered 1) individualized assistance and coaching depending on existing skills and experience and 2) services of creating a new resume using state of the art software for that purpose.


What to expect

The Career Navigator will assist with strategies regarding interviewing skills. The clients will have access to computers at the SJC where they can do market research and receive assistance with completing electronic applications for current available jobs. Career Navigator will facilitate the referrals from existing list of companies seeking to fill their rosters with new employees, keep track of successful placement during the year and provide reports to the Connecticut Children's on a periodic basis
